
The Gospel of the Church of the Wicked Vag



Introduction

Some of you will have heard of "The Gospel of the Flying Spaghetti Monster" by Bobby Henderson, a satirical scripture that challenges conventional religious doctrines with humor and wit. This revelatory text invites readers to explore the tenets of Pastafarianism, wherein a deity concocted of spaghetti and meatballs reigns supreme.

Well, **The Church of the Wicked Vag** has nothing to do noodly appendages, spaghetti, meatballs or flying. While still satirical, **The Church of the Wicked Vag** is based on a more realistic deity, **Flo.**

It often implies a designer, frequently associated with a deity or higher power, though it does not always specify the designer's identity.

Natural Selection

Species evolve over time through a process of variation, inheritance, and differential survival and reproduction, as proposed by Charles Darwin.

The complexity and diversity of life result from natural, undirected processes, without the need for an intelligent cause.

It is a scientific theory grounded in empirical evidence and forms a cornerstone of modern biology.




Religion

Encompasses various belief systems centered on the worship of one or more higher powers or deities.


Often includes creation narratives explaining the origins of the universe and life, alongside moral codes, rituals, and beliefs about the afterlife. It relies on faith, revelation, scripture, and tradition **rather than empirical evidence**.

Chapter 1: The Origin and Core Beliefs of Vagstafarianism

Just as nobody can truly understand a God/Goddess. They are mysterious, wonderful, resilient, compassionate, intelligent, creative and strong.

Some men are superficial, only chasing **beautiful women**, attracted to their looks and gaining respect from other men by their association with good-looking women. In reality, this excludes most men as one of the unwritten laws of attraction is that good-looking women prefer to mate with good-looking men.

Other men crave a woman who has a **nurturing** and empathetic nature. This often provides emotional warmth and understanding, creating a sense of comfort and connection that men deeply value. For those men who value **intellectual** stimulation, a woman who possesses intelligence, wit and charm, make them engaging and stimulating companions, fostering admiration and intellectual connection in relationships. Women who **uplift** and encourage men can empower them by offering support that boosts confidence and helps them pursue their goals, which can strengthen bonds through mutual growth. Then there are those men who seek women that can bring **spontaneity**, **adventure**, **and joy** into their lives, making relationships dynamic and fulfilling with their energy and enthusiasm. But, in all of the above scenarios, the woman remains a mysterious force.

Vagstafarians prefer not to make serious statements about science, education, and the nature of belief. But they do believe in the BIG BANG. They believe that random celestial bodies of both sexes were sucked into a cosmic vortex where they became trapped with nothing to do except mate. Over time, the ever-increasing number of celestial bodies humping caused enough molecular disturbance to shatter the vortex and release the entity called Flo – the product of numerous celestial bodies humping in unison (BIG BANG THEORY). But COW's significance extends beyond its parody roots, serving as a symbol in contemporary debates surrounding the meaning of life.

Philosophical and Existential Perspectives on Life's Meaning

Despite the diversity of these perspectives, **several universal insights** can bridge them. For every one of us it is a personal journey, transcending a singular, universal truth. Viktor Frankl, a philosopher and Holocaust survivor, poignantly stated, "**The meaning of life is to give life meaning.**"

By embracing absurdity, **Vagstafarianism** draws attention to the contradictions and logical flaws found in certain religious arguments. Humour is often more effective at getting a message across than guilt. I like to think of it as a variation of the 'carrot and stick' concept – with organized religion being the stick, and **Vagstafarianism** being the carrot.



Overall, **Vagstafarianism**, with the **The Church of the Wicked Vag** at its helm, employs humor and satire to promote a broader dialogue about belief, worship and religion. I doubt anyone reading this can argue with the fact that the majority of men on this Third Rock From The Sun worship women. And, just as in any other religion, there are many variants and sub-groups – each with their own brand.

Through the playful yet pointed nature of its core beliefs, **COW** reflects a deeper critique of dogmatic thinking and emphasizes the value of open-mindedness and critical inquiry in both religious and scientific endeavors.



Chapter 2: The Creation Myth

It has been noted by scientists that the steady rise in the spotted hyena population mirrors the steady increase in the number of followers of **COW**. This correlation is no coincidence. Studies show that over the last 50 years, the gender pay gap has narrowed, with women earning about 64% of men's earnings in 1975, rising to around 84% by 2022. This tongue-in-cheek rationale serves as a satire on how religious explanations have sometimes been used to account for natural progression, ignoring scientific evidence or common sense.

In summary, the **Vagstafarian** creation myth's portrayal of spotted hyenas as the honored followers of the **COW** serves multiple purposes. It humorously challenges traditional religious narratives, promotes values such as freedom and skepticism, and uses satire to comment on contemporary issues like equality of sexes. By weaving together these

elements, the myth enriches the narrative universe of **Vagstafarianism**, blending comedy with critical commentary.

Chapter 3: The 5 Vagstafarian Preferments

At the heart of **Vagstafarian** ethical guidelines are the **'5 Preferments'** serving as the commandments for followers of **The Church of the Wicked Vag**.

Unlike traditional religious commandments, which are often presented with solemnity and rigidity, the "5 Preferments'" embrace a tone of casual suggestion and humor, underscoring the playful nature of **Vagstafarianism**.

It is challenging starting a new religion/movement. Other religions, such as the Catholic Church have more money than God and centuries of brainwashing in their favour. That is difficult to compete with. But I am confident that **COW** has millions more followers than all the other religions combined. It is important to remember that being a member of another religion does not exclude you from being a follower of **COW**. Think of it as a **Venn diagram**.

COW teachings advocate for kindness and tolerance, opposing the use of religion as a tool for harm. This commandment highlights the ethical framework of **Vagstafarianism**, promoting compassion over dogma.

3. I'd prefer it if you did not judge others too quickly.

All of us are flawed in one way or another. Even you. This 'preferment' champions acceptance and anti-discrimination, urging **Vagstafarians** to embrace diversity and treat everyone with respect, regardless of superficial differences.

4. I'd prefer it if you didn't act like a dick.

With this guideline, **COW** advocates for consensual and responsible behavior among adults, emphasizing personal autonomy while also acknowledging the importance of ethical conduct in relationships. This includes excessive drinking and the taking of drugs. Know your limits – stick to them!

5. I'd prefer it if you treated ALL women with respect.

It is not uncommon for our carnal desires to overwhelm our logic, sensibility and common sense. Prevention is better than cure. If you are in no state to treat a woman with respect – walk away. The alternative is fraught with danger. We expect ALL followers of COW to treat women with respect. This might be more of a COMMANDMENT than a PREFERMENT.

Chapter 4: Scientific Theories and COW - Satire and Seriousness

Vagstafarianism, with its emphasis on worshipping the **Divine Feminine**, **Flo**, employs satire to highlight the absurdity of organized religion.

Belief and facts are not the same thing. In recent times, there have been cases of men identifying as women and women identifying as men (and everything else in between). It is their 'belief' that if they change their behaviour, style and pronouns that their wishes will magically come true. Factually speaking, if you kick one of these 'believers' between the legs, the facts regarding gender become apparent.

The same applies to formalized religion. You can believe as hard as you can, the fact remains that **hell is a place on earth and that women are the true goddesses.**

The clever framing of **Vagstafarian** beliefs and "evidence" mirrors traditional religious argumentation to such an extent that it becomes a mirror reflecting the controversies surrounding the teaching of evolution and showcases our ability to suspend logic in favor of fiction – suspension of disbelief.

The humor embedded in **Vagstafarianism** serves as an accessible entry point for people to engage with more serious issues regarding religious neutrality and the complexity of defining what constitutes a "legitimate" religion. It highlights the idea that if one were to accept religious teachings without empirical evidence, then one must also be prepared to

consider all whimsical beliefs on equal footing, which in essence, makes **COW** just as much of a legitimate 'religion' as any other.

Vagstafarianism uses its playful nature to deliver a potent message about the irrational nature of most formalized religions and employs satire to expose the vulnerabilities and potential consequences of allowing faith-based ideologies to encroach upon scientific discourse and basic common sense.

In essence, through its satirical depictions and humorous critiques, "The Gospel of the Church of the Wicked Vag" fosters a dialogue about the silliness of religion and the acceptance of fact – the main one being the fact that COW has more followers than any other 'religion'. The faux seriousness with which it presents COW as an alternative to organized religion serves to highlight our belief that mutual respect for one another is more important than what God you pray to – especially when you have no evidence to prove the existence of your deity.

Chapter 5: Embracing Flo. Rituals and Practices

Vagstafarian practices and rituals are as colorful and whimsical as the religion's fundamental beliefs. These rituals are laced with humor and parody, yet serve a deeper purpose in fostering camaraderie and fun among its followers.

One of the main rituals is the celebration of various holidays, the most well-known being "Laugh Like A Hyena Day." This holiday pays homage to the revered status of spotted hyenas in Vagstafarian lore, honoring them as the original and holiest Vagstafarians. On this day, practitioners don hyena costumes or masks, drink merrily and laugh like hyenas – all the while honoring Flo. It's a moment where the Vagstafarian community comes together to revel in their unique culture and collective jest.



Although the humble cranberry is the official fruit of **The Church of the Wicked Vag,** another notable ritual is the practice of the "**peach reach**," which involves the ceremonial eating of peaches without using hands or utensils.

This ritual emphasizes the wholesome goodness of **Vagstafarians** and is similar to the Catholic ritual known as the Eucharist, with the peach representing the essence of **Flo**, but in **Vagstafarianism** it is known as **persicum**. This ritual is usually followed by much revelry and peach gin and sometimes accompanied by the recitation of **Vagstafarian** ditties, which are filled with puns and light-hearted invocations to **Flo**. The observance of **Monday as a holy day** is another key component of **Vagstafarian** ritual. Unlike the Sabbath in other religions, Monday in **Vagstafarianism** is a day dedicated to rest and recuperation. Followers are encouraged to take it easy, stay in bed, and, if possible, partake in some form of revelry in the evening (sometimes known as "the hair of the hyena"). The observance of a day of recovery highlights the **Vagstafarian** emphasis on enjoyment and celebration of life.



Parody plays a significant role in these rituals, serving as a means of critiquing other religious practices and highlighting the arbitrary nature of many religious customs. For instance, drinking out of glass jam jars (canning jars) is encouraged amongst

Vagstafarians, as historically and culturally, the act of canning and preserving peaches has been associated with women, who have traditionally taken on roles of nurturing and providing for the family. The canning jar (common or garden variety glass jar) thus symbolizes skill and care, often passed down through generations of women.

Sometimes, followers might tie their jam jars around their neck to facilitate ease of use. This practice is gaining in popularity and underscores the movement's challenge to traditional religious norms and the importance of staying hydrated.

"Ode to Flo, Our Goddess Peach" (sung to the tune of 'Amazing Grace')


